s4: Native Trustee's Account to be one common account.
s5: Public Trustee may transfer securities in lieu of cash to Native Trustee.
s10: Deposits in common fund may be accepted from Natives.
- Commentary:** This Act deals mostly mostly with finance matters and management of Native Trust office and sets up the necessary machinery for working the funds which the Native Trust office had taken over from the Public Trustee. Ngata refers to problems the Native Trust Office has had getting up and running because of lack of ready cash as the majority of its assets were in the form of securities and so the Trustee did not have money to lend to Maori.
