ss61 - 63: Surrender or determination of outstanding leases or licenses granted by Native or other owners prior to acquisition of land by the Crown.

*s***70**: Prospecting licenses for Native Land. *s***103**: Rent payable.

*s***450**: Validation of certain Mining privileges.
