17 different timelines relating to subjects such as survey charges, or the removal of restrictions on alienation. The relevant sections of the statutes are gathered together so that the changes over time are more obvious. The exact dates that sections came into force and ceased to be in force are noted.
- B: Case Annotations..... Page 81**
References to reported Court cases relating to 57 pieces of Maori land legislation over the period 1862 - 1909. The references are from *Butterworths Annotations of New Zealand Statutes*.
- C: Memorandum on the History of Native-Land Legislation Page 95**
Written by Sir John Salmond to accompany the 1909 Native Land Bill. As well as giving a synopsis of legislation from 1862 - 1908 it also outlines the provisions of the 1909 Native Land Act.
- D: Bills Page 109**
A list of 32 Bills which were presented to the House of Representatives by the MPs for the Maori seats but which were not passed into law. Many of the Bills embody Maori requests for changes in the Native Land Court system.
