

EMBAJADA DE MEXICO

London, 28th February, 1969.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform you that, in order to facilitate travel between our two countries, the Government of Mexico is prepared to enter into an agreement with the Government of New Zealand, expressed in the following terms:

1. Mexican nationals possessing valid Mexican passports who desire to enter New Zealand temporarily, and whose entry into New Zealand has been approved, will receive visas free of charge from the appropriate New Zealand visa issuing authority.
2. New Zealand citizens possessing valid New Zealand passports who desire to enter Mexico as bona fide non-immigrants (tourist and transit visitors), and whose entry into Mexico has been approved

Your Excellency Sir Denis Blundell, K.B.E.,

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approved, will receive visas free of charge from the appropriate Mexican visa issuing authority.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, it is understood:

(a) that Mexican nationals entering New Zealand and New Zealand citizens entering Mexico are not exempted from the necessity of complying with the New Zealand and Mexican laws and regulations concerning the entry, residence, and gainful employment or occupation of aliens; and

(b) that travellers who are unable to satisfy the respective immigration authorities that they comply with the laws and regulations referred to in the immediately preceding subparagraph are liable to be refused permission to enter or land.

4. The present agreement shall not extend to the Cook Islands, Niue and the Tokelau Islands.

5. The present agreement shall enter into force on 29th April 1969 and shall remain in force until ninety days after the date on which

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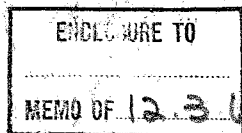
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either party notifies the other in writing of its desire to terminate the agreement.

Should the above proposals prove acceptable to the Government of New Zealand, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply thereto should be regarded as constituting an agreement on the matter between our two Governments.

Señor Alto Comisionado:

Tengo la honra de informar a Vuestra Excelencia que, con objeto de facilitar el intercambio de viajeros entre nuestros dos países, el Gobierno de México está dispuesto a concertar un Acuerdo con el Gobierno de Nueva Zelandia, en los siguientes términos:

1.- Los mexicanos en posesión de pasaportes mexicanos válidos que deseen entrar a Nueva Zelandia temporalmente y cuya internación en Nueva Zelandia haya sido aprobada, recibirán visas en forma gratuita de las autoridades neozelandesas respectivas que las expidan.

2.- Los ciudadanos de Nueva Zelandia en posesión de pasaportes neozelandeses válidos que deseen entrar a México como no inmigrantes de buena fe (turistas y transmigrantes), y cuya internación en México haya sido aprobada, recibirán visas en forma gratuita de las autoridades mexicanas respectivas que las expidan.

3.- No obstante

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3.- No obstante lo anterior, queda entendido:

a) Que los mexicanos que entren a Nueva Zelandia y los neozelandeses que entren a México no están exentos de la necesidad de cumplir con las leyes y disposiciones neozelandesas y mexicanas relativas a la entrada, residencia y ocupación o empleo remunerado de extranjeros; y,

b) Que los viajeros que no puedan satisfacer ante las autoridades migratorias correspondientes que cumplen con las leyes y disposiciones a que se hace referencia en el subpárrafo inmediato anterior, quedan sujetos a que se les niegue el permiso de internación.

4.- El presente Acuerdo no es aplicable a las Islas Cook, a Niue y a las Islas Tokelau.

5.- El presente Acuerdo entrará en vigor el 29 de abril de 1969, y continuará en vigor hasta noventa días después de que cualquiera de las partes notifique a la otra por escrito, su deseo de dar por terminado el Acuerdo.


