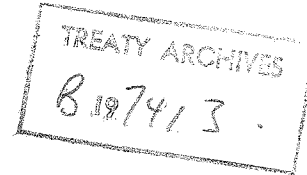

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 21 December 1973, by which you kindly conveyed to me the offer of your Government to host the 4th session of the International Coordination Group for the Tsunami Warning System in the Pacific from 4 to 7 February 1974.

I wish to express to your Government my warm thanks for this generous offer and to inform you that the terms contained in your letter are acceptable to Unesco.

I accordingly agree that your letter and this reply should constitute an agreement between Unesco and the Government of New Zealand with effect from today.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of New Zealand is willing to act as host for the Fourth Session of the International Coordination Group for the Tsunami Warning System in the Pacific, at Wellington from 4 to 7 February 1974.

I have the honour to propose that the meeting be held on the following basis:

1. UNESCO shall ensure that invitations are issued to members of the Coordination Group, and that an Agenda and appropriate documentation are prepared.
2. UNESCO shall make available to the Government of New Zealand, through the National Commission for UNESCO, US\$1,000 towards defraying the cost of the meeting.
3. The Government of New Zealand shall provide, for the duration of the meeting, suitable meeting and office premises.
4. The Government of New Zealand shall also provide, for the duration of the meeting, such services and facilities as are necessary for the smooth running of the meeting.
5. The Government of New Zealand undertakes to conduct the meeting on the basis of the rules and procedures applied at previous meetings of the Coordination Group.
6. The Government of New Zealand also undertakes to accord participants at the meeting the benefits set out in Annex IV of the Convention of the privileges and immunities of the specialised agencies of the United Nations.

If the foregoing terms are acceptable to UNESCO, I have the honour to propose that this letter and your reply thereto should constitute an agreement between UNESCO and the Government of New Zealand which shall enter into force from the date of your reply.
