Without prejudice to the provisions of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, the Government undertakes to accord all participants such privileges and immunities and facilities and courtesies as are necessary for the independent exercise of their functions related to the purpose of the Workshop.

All persons entitled to participate in the Workshop and all persons performing functions in connexion with the Workshop who are not nationals of the host country shall have the right of entry into and exit from the host country. They shall be granted facilities for speedy travel. Visas and entry permits, where required, shall be granted free of charge, as speedily as possible and, when applications are made at least two and a half weeks before the opening of the Workshop, not later than two weeks before the date of the opening of the Workshop. If the application for the visa is not made at least two and a half weeks before the opening of the Workshop, the visa shall be granted not later than three days from the receipt of the application. Exit permits, where required, shall be granted free of charge, as speedily as possible, and in any case not later than three days before the closing of the Workshop.

The host Government shall deal with all claims and other demands arising out of injury or damage to persons or property in the premises where the meeting is held and shall hold the United Nations and its personnel harmless in respect of such claims and other demands.
