I N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, William Downie Stewart, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that the following native game—viz. godwits—may be killed within the Mangonui—Whangarca Acclimatization District, comprising the counties of Mongo-nui and Whangaroa (except in the areas mentioned in the Schedule hereto), from the first day of January, one thousand March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three (both days inclusive). And I do further notify that licenses to kill such native game within the said district shall be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings each, and that the Postmasters at Mangonui, Awanui, Fairburn's, Kaeo, Saies, Waiharara, and Kaitaia are hereby appointed to sign and issue the said licenses.

Nothing in any license to take or kill godwits shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill godwits on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain.
