

Colours prescribed for Figures on Indication Discs in terms of the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1932.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 13 of the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1932, I, Robert Semple, Minister of Transport, do hereby declare that the colours for the figures on indication discs for the license year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1939, shall be as follows:—

- For the number "1" (indicating the first quarter), yellow ochre.
- For the number "2" (indicating the second quarter), cobalt blue.
- For the number "3" (indicating the third quarter), scarlet.
- For the number "4" (indicating the fourth quarter), emerald.

The Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its Amendments.—Fixing the Closing-hours of Butchers' Shops within the Borough of Hawera.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing has been forwarded to me from the occupiers of butchers' shops within the Borough of Hawera pursuant to section 32 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas I am satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said borough:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 32, I, William Edward Parry, acting for the Minister of Labour, do hereby direct that on and after the 13th day of March, 1939, all the butchers' shops within the said borough shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays at 5 p.m., with the following exceptions:—

(1) Should the occupier of any shop affected by this notice observe, pursuant to section 14 (2) of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, Saturday as the statutory closing-day, then, and in such case, the closing-hour on Wednesday for such shop shall be 5 p.m.

(2) On the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day and on the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day the hour of closing shall be 8.30 p.m.

The notice gazetted on the 2nd day of February, 1928, fixing the closing-hours of butchers' shops within the Borough of Hawera is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.
