The Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939.—(Notice No. Ag. 3685).

GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of September, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,-
 - "Controller" means the Primary Industries Controller appointed under these regulations; and includes any person for the time being authorized to exercise or perform any of the powers or functions of the Controller:
 - "Cool store" means any premises in which any primary product is deposited for the purpose of being chilled, cooled, or frozen, or for the purpose of being stored at a temperature

 - "Dairy-produce" means dairy-produce as defined by the Dairy Industry Act, 1908:
 "Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture; and includes any person for the time being authorized to exercise or perform any of the Minister's powers or functions:
 - "Person" includes a corporation sole, and also a body of persons whether corporate or unincorporate:
 - "Primary product" means dairy-produce, wool, agricultural seeds, phormium fibre, vegetables of all kinds, tomatoes, meat and stock as defined by the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908, and fruit as defined by the Orchard-tax Act, 1927; and includes any by-product of the dairy-produce and meat-production industries; and also includes fertilizers, lime, manure, and feeding stuffs for stock:
- 3. (1) These regulations shall be administered by the Minister of Agriculture.
