The Courts Emergency Powers Regulations 1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of September, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Courts Emergency Powers Regulations 1939.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day following the day on which notification of the making thereof is published in the *Gazette*.
 - 2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 "Judgment" means any judgment or order of any Court
 (whether given or made before or after the commencement
 of these regulations) for the payment or recovery of a sum
 of money or for the recovery of possession of land in default
 of payment of rent; but does not include—
 - (a) Any judgment for the recovery of damages for tort; (b) Any order made under the Destitute Persons Act,
 - 1910;
 (c) Any order made either in criminal proceedings or in proceedings for the recovery of a penalty in respect of any contravention of or failure to comply with any provisions of an Act:
