HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General acting by and the former of **P** the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby license and permit Mrs. Alberta McLean, of Whangapoua (hereinafter called "the licensee," which term shall include her executors, administrators, and assigns, unless the context requires a different construction), to use and occupy all those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Whangapoua Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2194, approved on the twenty-second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of the use of the

wharf as shown on the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the licensee for the use of the said wharf.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms-

- 'Foreshore'" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and un-covered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides: "Low-water mark " means low-water mark at ordinary
- spring tides :
- means the Minister of Marine as defined by " Minister the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto

foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 2194. **3.** In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1 and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 21st day of September, 1939, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council. **4.** All persons shall at all reasonable times and upon pay-ment of the proper dues have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and

said wharf and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without 6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf

in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the licensee's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

by the Minister. 7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

Minister for that purpose. 10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 21st day of September, 1939, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the wharf at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.
