

RAGLAN COUNTY COUNCIL.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TAKE LANDS FOR ROADS.

In the matter of the Public Works Act, 1928, and the Counties Act, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Raglan County Council proposes, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts, to execute a certain public work—namely, the formation of a road—and for the purpose of such public work the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken.

Notice is further given that a plan of the lands so required to be taken for roads is deposited in the public offices of the Clerk to the said Council at Ngaruawahia, and is open for inspection by all persons during ordinary office hours. All persons affected by the execution of the said public work, or by the taking of the said lands, who have any well-founded objections to the execution of the said public work, or to the taking of the said lands, must state their objections in writing and send the same on or before the 11th day of November, 1939, being a date not more than forty days from the first publication of this notice to the Raglan County Council at the Council Chambers, Waingaro Road, Ngaruawahia.
