And whereas the Land Board of the North Auckland Land District has duly passed resolutions recommending that the portion of the Hohoura Kauri-gum Reserve Extension No. 2, as described in the Schedule hereto, be excepted from the operations of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the portion of the Hohoura Kauri-gum Reserve Extension No. 2, as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908.

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the southern side of the portion of Neville Street, or the western side of the portion of Owen Street (described in the Schedule hereto), within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-lines of the said portions of streets.
