**NOTICE TO TRADERS REGARDING GOODS SHIPPED TO NEUTRAL COUNTRIES IN EUROPE.**

THE Ministry of Economic Warfare desires to give notice that  
all goods covered by the Contraband List which are shipped  
on or after 20th November, 1939, to neutral countries in  
Europe consigned "to order" or to forwarding agents  
without specifying the names of buyers will be liable to  
seizure by the Contraband Committee.

This does not of course affect the existing arrangements  
under which bills of lading made out "to order" to a bank  
or accepting house and bearing the inscription "notify  
buyer, Messrs...." will be regarded as equivalent to a bill  
made out to a named consignee. It will be appreciated that  
this arrangement is based on the assumption that the person  
to be notified would not be a forwarding agent.
