ALL those areas in the Auckland Land District, Taumarunui County, containing by admeasurement a total area of 11,894 acres 1 rood 3 perches, more or less, and being Sections 1 to 14 inclusive, Block XIV, Ongarue Survey District, Sections 5 to 14 inclusive, Block XIII, Hurakia Survey District, Sections 1 to 11 inclusive, Block IV, Tuhua Survey District, and Sections 1 to 7 inclusive, Block I, Puketapu Survey District. As the same are more particularly delineated on plan No. 52/8, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red. (Auckland plans S.O. 23204, 23206, 23208, 23210, and 30398.)

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by subsection nine of section twelve of the Land Act, 1924, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof the land comprised in the pieces of closed road described in the First Schedule hereto, being land which is adjacent to the endowment for primary education described in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to be added to the said endowment.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the road described in the Schedule hereto traverses Native land and has been used by the public as a public road and has been formed, improved, and maintained out of public funds:

And whereas the Native Land Court, by an order made on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and issued pursuant to section four hundred and eighty-four of the Native Land Act, 1931, ordered and declared the said road to be a public road:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that it is in the public interest that the said road should be proclaimed as a public road, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands in terms of section four hundred and eighty-six of the Native Land Act, 1931:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section four hundred and eighty-seven of the Native Land Act, 1931, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road described in the Schedule hereto.
