THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Oamaru Borough Council on the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, viz. :—

“ That the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to that part of the north-western side of Tay Street abutting—

- (a) On Allotment 24, on a plan of part of the Township of Newburgh, deposited in the Land Registry Office at Dunedin as number 1630 (Allotment 24 being included in certificates of title, Vol. 218, folio 123 and Vol. 210, folio 123);
- (b) On Allotment 26, shown on the said deposited plan, and included in certificate of title, Vol. 220, folio 79;
- (c) On that half of Allotment 25, shown on the said deposited plan, adjoining said Allotment 24, and included in certificate of title, Vol. 187, folio 69 ”;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the north-western side of the portions of Tay Street (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-lines of the said portions of street.

SCHEDULE.

THE north-western side of all that portion of street, situated in the Otago Land District, Borough of Oamaru, known as Tay Street, fronting Allotment 24 and part Allotment 25, D.P. 1630, Township of Newburgh.

Also the north-western side of all that portion of street, situated in the said land district and borough, known as Tay Street, fronting Allotment 26, D.P. 1630, Township of Newburgh.

As the same are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 102441, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon edged red.
