*Authorizing Percy Diserens and Ralph Diserens, of Gowan Bridge, Nelson, Storekeepers, to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Percy Diserens and Ralph Diserens, of Gowan Bridge, Nelson, Storekeepers (hereinafter referred to as "the licensees"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to take and use from an unnamed stream situated in Section 4, Block IX, Hope Survey District, for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding one cubic foot per second at any one time.

CONDITIONS.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations, 1934, the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, and the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 3 kilowatts at 230 volts direct current, and shall be taken from an unnamed stream at the point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 101823, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensees are hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 101823:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of an intake, water-race, and pipe-lines leading to the water-wheel and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 100 ft.
- (b) A power-house situated on part Section 4, Block IX, Hope Survey District, with all necessary equipment, including water-turbine or wheel, generators, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (c) Water-race and pipe-line leading from the power-house to the Buller River.

5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1960, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board, or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensees may install a suitable maximum-demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 3 kilowatts.
