**W**HEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the "said land") is Crown land not acquired under the Land for Settlements Act, 1925, but is adjacent to certain land acquired under the said Act and known as the Puni Settlement and can conveniently be disposed of therewith:
