Alteration of Boundaries of Kaingaroa Plantation Fire District.

WHEREAS by a notice published in the Gazette on the 9th day of November, 1922, at page 2960 (hereinafter referred to as "the said notice"), a certain area in the Auckland Land District was declared to be a fire district under section 27 of the Forests Act, 1921–22 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and named the Kaingaroa Plantetico Fire District.
