Stocks of Flour, Wheat, and Oats.

A CENSUS of stocks of flour, wheat, and oats in the Dominion was taken as at the 30th November, 1940, when the following quantities were returned: Flour, 17,774 tons; wheat, 2,653,697 bushels (including 2,400,263 bushels of milling-wheat); and 589,660 bushels of oats. Returns were received covering all stocks owned or stored by millers, merchants, and farmers throughout the Dominion, with a few unimportant exceptions which would not appreciably affect the totals given.
