WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, consent was given to the raising by the Manukau County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority")

of the sum of fifty-five thousand four hundred pounds (£55,400) by a loan to be known as "Mangere Special Area Water-supply Loan, 1930" (hereinafter called "the said "), of which an amount of five thousand four hundred pounds (£5,400) has not yet been raised:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section nine of the Local Loans Board Act, 1920, and by section line of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum or any part thereof for the purposes for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:
