The Ships and Aircraft Detention Emergency Regulations 1940.

GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of April, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL. PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Ships and Aircraft Detention Emergency Regulations 1940.
- 2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Aircraft" has the same meaning as in the Aviation Emergency Regulations 1939:
 - "Port" includes any dock, harbour, pier, quay, wharf,
 - mooring, anchorage, or other similar place:
 "Ship" includes every description of vessel used in navigation not propelled by oars.
