The Papawai and Kaikokirikiri Trusts Board Empowering Act, 1940.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the General Assembly of New Zealand in the ensuing session by Arthur Lloyd Hansell, of Wellington, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Ernest Henry Anderson, of Day's Bay, near Wellington, Retired Merchant (hereinafter called "the promoters"), for leave to bring in a Private Bill, the short title of which is as above, to effect the following objects and purposes, viz:—
