Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section twenty of the Mining Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby exempt the land particularly described in the Schedule hereto from the provisions of section sixty-six (f) and sections one hundred and forty-four to one hundred and fifty-two (inclusive) of the Mining Act, 1926, and regulations one hundred and five and one hundred and six of the regulations thereunder, subject to existing registered mining privileges, and do also hereby declare that such exemption shall take effect from the date of the publication of this notice in the Gazette. of this notice in the Gazette.
