

Classification of Road in Southland County.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Transport Department Act, 1929, and the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1940, the Minister of Transport does hereby revoke that Warrant dated the 24th day of March, 1936, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 27 of the 2nd day of April, 1936, in so far as it relates to the classification of the road described in the Schedule hereto, and does hereby approve of the Southland County Council's proposed classification of the road described in the Schedule hereto and situated in the Southland County.

ROAD classified in Class Three: Available for the use thereon of any multi-axled heavy motor-vehicle or any trailer which with the load it is carrying has an axle weight of not more than 5 tons on any one axle, or of any other heavy motor-vehicle which with the load it is carrying has an axle weight of not more than 5½ tons on any one axle.
