IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the portions of road described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, be under the control and management of the Auckland City Council.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution, passed by the Dunedin City Council on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty, viz:—

“That the Dunedin City Council, being the local authority having control of the streets in the City of Dunedin, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the south-western side of portion of Preston Crescent abutting on Allotment 4, Block IV, D.P. 444, Belleknowes Estate”;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the south-western side of the portion of Preston Crescent (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said portion of street.
