## EKETAHUNA COUNTY COUNCIL.

## RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Eketahuna County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of five thousand pounds (£5,000), authorized to be raised by the Eketahuna County Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of readvances by the Council under the Rural Housing Act, 1939, and its amendments, the said Eketahuna County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-tenth of a penny ( $\frac{1}{10}$ d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the whole of the County of Eketahuna; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and payable yearly on the 1st day of September, in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off."

## Rural Housing Loan, 1940, £10,000.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Waitomo County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £10,000, authorized to be raised by the Waitomo County Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of making advances to farmers under the provisions of the Rural Housing Act, 1939, the said Waitomo County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of nine thirty-seconds pence ( $\frac{9}{32}$ d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of the whole of the rateable property in the County of Waitomo; and such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the first day of October in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off."
