THE following register of teachers is issued under the authority of the Minister of Education in accordance with the provisions of the Education Amendment Act, 1924. The register contains the names of the following persons:—

- (a) Every person who is permanently employed as a "teacher" within the meaning of the Act.
- (b) Every person who, though not permanently employed as a teacher on the 1st of January, 1940, was the holder of a teacher's certificate or a license to teach and who, not having notified his or her retirement from the teaching profession, is known to have been actively engaged in the work of education at some time within the last two years.

Where a teacher's certificate is held the class is shown in each case. The abbreviation "Lic." under the heading of "Certificate" signifies that the teacher holds a license to teach only.

Primary, secondary, or technical grading is shown under the heading "Grading," "P. 100" *e.g.*, denotes a primary grading 100, "Sec. C" a secondary grading of Grade C, and "Tech. D II, C V" a technical grading of Division II, Class V. Under this heading also will be shown the nature of the employment of the following other persons engaged in educational work. The abbreviations used are shown in parentheses: Inspectors of Schools (Insp.), Lecturers in Training Colleges (Tr. Coll.), Professors and Lecturers in Universities (Univ.), Departmental Officers (Dept.).

Attention is drawn to the regulations, under which any teacher who considers that he has good ground of objection to the position assigned to him on the graded list may lodge an appeal by letter to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of the list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—*i.e.*, appeals must reach the Department not later than the 28th of May, 1941. An appeal must be made on the prescribed form, which may be obtained

on application to the Director of Education, Wellington, and must contain a complete and definite statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.
