

2. The said Board shall prepare a report each year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of receipts and expenditure in connection with the said reserves. Such report and statement shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the said Act as soon as possible after the close of the year.

3. The said Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT.—TAIHAPE SCENIC RESERVES.

ALL that area containing by admeasurement 200 acres 1 rood and 6 perches, more or less, being Sections 63, 64, 79, 80, and part Section 62, Block XIV, Ohinewairua Survey District, the said part of Section 62 being bounded as follows: Towards the north and west by Sections 65 and 46A, Block
