A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been found desirable for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the Kaipara-Waikato Railway to take further land at Tuakau in addition to land previously acquired for the purposes of the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections thirty-four and two hundred and sixteen of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes above mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE areas of the pieces of land :—

0	0	6.79	Part Lot 1, D.P. 16549, and being part Allotment 18, Parish of Tuakau; coloured blue.
0	0	3.84	Part Lot 2, D.P. 16549, and being part Allotment 18, Parish of Tuakau; coloured orange.

Situated in Block IV, Onewhero Survey District, Tuakau Town District. (S.O. 31491.)

In the North Auckland Land District; as the same are more particularly delineated on the plan marked L.O. 6545, deposited in the office of the Minister of Railways at Wellington, and thereon coloured as above mentioned.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for a Native school; and I do also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one.
