

Setting apart Unalienated Crown Land for the Purposes of Part III (State Coal-mines) of the Coal-mines Act, 1925.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by subsection one of section one hundred and sixty-seven of the Coal-mines Act, 1925, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the unalienated Crown land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby set apart for the purposes of Part III of the said Act, and do hereby further declare that this notice shall take effect as from the date of the gazetting hereof.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area of unalienated Crown land, situated in the Westland Land District, containing 78 acres 0 roods 22 perches, more or less, being Reserve 184 (formerly part Sections 1 and 2), situated in Block I, Cobden Survey District. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked Mines N. 6/4/17, deposited in the Head Office of the Department of Mines at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Everett Road Scenic Board.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely:—

Elmer Clive Cooper,
John Alexander Ross,
Frederick Bracegirdle,
John Robson Gray Sutherland,
The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Taranaki Land District (*ex officio*),
The Chairman of the Inglewood County Council (*ex officio*), and
The Mayor of the Borough of Inglewood (*ex officio*),

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Everett Road Scenic Reserve Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the Borough Council Chambers, Rata Street, Inglewood, on the first Wednesday in the months of December and June in each year, at eight o'clock p.m., or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the

Board. The first meeting shall be held at half-past two o'clock p.m. on Wednesday, the fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

7. (a) The Board may make such rules as it deems necessary—

(i) Governing trading within the reserve; and
(ii) Controlling or limiting the taking of collections within the reserve for any objects other than the improvement of the reserve.

(b) The Board may appropriate open portions of the reserve for parking-places for vehicles for the convenience of persons using the reserve, and fix such charges for the use of such parking-places as the Minister approves.

8. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

9. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

10. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.
