Class C.—On the unimproved value of all lands so classified as Class C, ninety-three one-hundredths of a penny (0.93d.) in the pound.

Class D.—On the unimproved value of all lands so classified as Class D, thirty-one one-hundredths of a penny (0.31d.) in the pound.

Oil Fuel Retail Hours (Wellington) Order, No. 2, 1940, Amendment No. 1.

PURSUANT to the Oil Fuel Retail Hours Emergency Regulations (No. 2) 1940, and pursuant to the powers in that behalf therein contained, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, do hereby direct as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Oil Fuel Retail Hours (Wellington) Order, No. 2, 1940, Amendment No. 1.
2. This Order shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.
3. The Oil Fuel Retail Hours (Wellington) Order, No. 2, 1940, is hereby amended by deleting from clause 7 thereof the name of A. E. Newrick and substituting therefor the name of E. W. Jepson.
