Allocating Land reserved and taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Road in the Rangitikei County, at Turakina.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Foxton - New Plymouth Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a road: Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section two hundred and twenty-six of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall upon the publication hereof in the New Zealand Guzette. and decrare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, become a road, and that the said road shall be under the control of the Rangitikei County Council, and shall be maintained by the said Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Council.
