New Main Channel.

Previous Notice.—No. 25 of 1941.

Position: Lat., 37° 05' S.; long., 174° 26' E. (approx.).

Alteration: A new main channel has formed approximately one-third of a mile north of the recent one, and on or about October 30th the leading beacons when in transit 077° will lead over the bar.

The upper beacon will be the extreme southern edge of the Signalman's house.

Recent soundings in this new channel taken by the Masters of the M.v. "Hokianga" and "Hauturu" gave a least depth of 21 ft. L.W.O.S.
