1. This Order may be cited as the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 1.
2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

3. The principal Order shall be and is hereby varied as follows, namely:—

"The suspension effected by clause 3 of the principal Order in respect of payment for time worked on holidays shall not apply to the workers coming within the scope of the Wellington City Council (Milk Department) Employees' award dated the 3rd day of December, 1940, and recorded in Book of Awards, Volume 40, page 2196."

4. This Order shall be deemed to have come into effect on the 17th day of December, 1941.
