- 6. Within seven days of the importation of any quantity of kapoc the importer thereof shall furnish the Factory Controller with details of the importation, stating the quantity imported.
- 7. No person who after the coming into force of this notice imports any kapoc shall thereafter sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of any kapoc (whether be be the kapoc so imported or any other kapoc) without the precedent consent in writing of the Factory Controller.
