"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £66,800, authorized to be raised by the Dunedin Drainage and Sewerage Board under the abovementioned Act, the said Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one penny (1d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value (on the basis of the annual value) of all rateable property of the district, comprising the whole of the City of Dunedin and the Borough of St. Kilda; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the first (1st) day of June in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of seventeen (17) years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
