The Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice 1942, No. 2.

PURSUANT to the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942, I, James Ewing Thomas, Rationing Controller, hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This Notice may be cited as the Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice 1942, No. 2.

2. The Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice 1942* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule the following:—

“Knitting yarn ½ coupon per oz.”

3. The appropriate number of coupons in relation to the following goods rationed under the Clothing Rationing Order 1942 shall be in accordance with the following Schedule:—
