W HEREAS it is provided by section thirty-one of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General in Council may, on the application of any Fire Board established under the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, extend the powers of that Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the third day of And whereas by Order in Council dated the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty, and published in the Gazette on the 4th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty, at page 643, the powers of the Nelson Fire Board were extended, but not so as to exceed the sum of eleven thousand one hundred and thirty pounds:

And whereas application has been made by the said Nelson

Fire Board for further extension of borrowing-powers and it is desirable to grant such request:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the powers of the said Board to borrow moneys in excess of the limits fixed by the said section thirty-one are hereby extended, but so as not to exceed the sum of thirteen thousand nine hundred pounds: Provided that no moneys as aforesaid shall be borrowed except subject to the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, and its amendments.

Land temporarily reserved in the North Auckland Land District for Recreation Purposes.
