

(5) Where any such onions are sold by retail in any lots exceeding 5 lb., but otherwise than in a lot of the actual weight specified in the last preceding subclause, the maximum price of any surplus over 5 lb. or over any multiple of 5 lb. (being less in every case than 5 lb.) shall be at the rate of the appropriate maximum price fixed by subclause (3) hereof.

(6) If in respect of any lot of onions sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence, of half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

12. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any onions to which this Order applies shall keep for a period of not less than two months a record showing with respect to every purchase of such onions made by him by way of wholesale the following particulars:—

- (a) The date of purchase;
- (b) The name and address of wholesaler from whom purchased;
- (c) The trade description of the onions purchased;
- (d) The quantity purchased;
- (e) The price paid.
