 “Commodities” means bread and meat:  
 “The district” means the area of the Borough of Te Puke as at present constituted:  
 “Wholesale purchaser” means a person who purchases commodities for resale or for transport to an area outside the district or for consumption at a military camp, hotel, hospital, or similar institution requiring large supplies of commodities daily.

(2) It shall be a condition of this scheme that—

- (a) Bread and meat shall be delivered within the district to the premises of wholesale purchasers only, subject to the provisions of clause (b) hereafter:
- (b) Meat may be delivered in the district by any vendor to any person, whether or not that person is a wholesale purchaser for the purposes of the scheme, on such three days in any week during the months of December, January, and February in each year, and on such two days in any week during the months of March to November (inclusive) in each year, as the Minister or a Zoning Officer shall from time to time appoint in respect of the scheme.
