PURSUANT to section five of the Native Purposes Act, 1937, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby set apart and reserve the Native freehold land described in the Schedule hereto as a Native reservation for the common use of the Ngatituhapu of the Ngaruahine Tribe as a bathing-place.

THE parcel of land containing 10 acres, more or less, situated in Block VI, Waimate Survey District, being part of the Otamare Block. As the same is shown coloured pink on the plan marked N.D. 21/3/109, lodged in the Head Office of the Native Department at Wellington.
