The Military Manœuvres Act, 1915.—Declaration that certain Lands shall be available for Military Manœuvres.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section two of the Military Manœuvres Act, 1915, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall, as from the date of this Proclamation and thereafter during the present war or until this Proclamation shall be revoked, be available for military manœuvres under the said

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south bank of the Manawatu River opposite the north boundary of Section 1, Block XI, Mount Robinson Survey District, and proceeding thence generally north-easterly following the south bank of the Manawatu River to its intersection with the Main Woodville-Greytown Highway at Ngawapurua combined road and railway bridge; thence proceeding generally southwards following the western boundary of that highway to its junction with the northern boundary of Mauriceville County between Eketahuna and Greytown; thence generally westerly following the northern boundary of Mauriceville County to the junction of the Mauriceville, Eketahuna, and Horowhenua Counties; thence by a right line to the point of commencement, being portions of the Counties of Horowhenua, Kairanga, Pahiatua, and Eketahuna.

As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 30/4, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red and thereon bordered red.

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section four hundred and eighty-seven of the Native Land Act, 1931, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road described in the Schedule hereto.
