PURSUANT to the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942, I, James Ewing Thomas, Rationing Controller, hereby give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice No. 8.\*
2. The Clothing Rationing Coupon Notice No. 6 is hereby revoked.
3. The appropriate number of coupons in relation to the following goods rationed under the Clothing Rationing Order 1942 shall be in accordance with the following Schedule.

Fully fashioned, of lisle, cashmere, or silk and wool	2 coupons ("M," "O," or clothing coupons).
Circular or mock-fashioned . . . . .	1 coupon ("M," "O," or clothing coupon).
