The Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 25

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 25.

2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

3. The principal Order is varied as follows, namely: The provisions of the principal Order shall not apply to the workers coming within the scope of the awards specified in the following Schedule, namely:—
