7. Except in accordance with the terms and conditions of a written permit granted by the Naval Control Service Officer at Wellington, no master or person in charge of any small craft within the meaning of the Public Traffic Regulations 1939 for the Port of Wellington, being a vessel to which the Shipping Control Emergency Regulations 1939 for the time being apply, shall cause or permit the vessel to be in any part of the waters described in the Fourth Schedule hereto: Schedule hereto:

Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply with respect to any such small craft entering the port and passing through the

examination service.
