The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

#### 3. System of Supply

The system of supply shall be two-wire direct current-Electrical energy shall be transmitted at a pressure of 32 volts direct current between terminals.

### 4. Duration of License

Unless lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1964, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.
