NOTICE is hereby give that written tenders for the purchase of the undermentioned milling-timber will close at the office of the State Forest Service, Invercargill, at 3 p.m. on Wednesday, 3rd May, 1944.

SOUTHLAND CONSERVANCY.—SOUTHLAND LAND DISTRICT

ALL the milling-timber on that piece of land containing 138 acres, situated in Block I, Lillburn Survey District, State Forest No. 53, approximately eight miles from the Tuatapere Railway-station.

Terms of Payment

A marked cheque for £320, being deposit on the purchase-price, together with £1 1s., license fee, must accompany the tender, and the balance be paid in twenty-one (21) equal monthly instalments, the first of which shall be made one month after the date of sale.

Terms and Conditions

1. All instalment-payments shall be secured by "on demand" promissory notes made and endorsed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of State Forests, and interest at the rate of 1 per cent per annum in excess of current bank overdraft rates will be charged on all notes overdue from the date of maturity to the date of payment.

2. The right to cut and remove the timber will be sold in accordance with the provisions of the Forests Act, 1921-22, the regulations in force thereunder, and these conditions.

3. The aforementioned quantities and kinds as to the said timber shall be taken as sufficiently accurate for the purposes of this sale, and no contract for the purchase shall be voidable, nor shall the successful purchaser be entitled to any abatement in price by reason of the said timber being of less quantity or kind as stated herein or in any advertisement having reference to the said timber.

4. A return giving the number of logs cut of each species and their contents must be made quarterly by the licensee on the last days of March, June, September, and December, respectively, in each year. A return must also be made on the same dates showing the output of sawn timber of each species. These returns may be ascertained and verified by inspection of the books of the mill, or by
