*The Pig Marketing Emergency Regulations 1943.—Amending Notice fixing Prices and Basic Values*

**P**URSUANT to Regulation 5 of the Pig Marketing Emergency Regulations 1943, I hereby further amend the notice (given under my hand on the 3rd day of November, 1943, and published in the *Gazette* on the 4th day of the same month at page 1287) which fixes the maximum prices that an operator may pay for pigs, by declaring that operators may pay for all kinds and grades of pigs, except choppers, purchased or killed during the month of May, 1944, prices greater by one halfpenny per pound dressed weight (including head) than the prices fixed by the said notice as heretofore amended.
