Price Order No. 245 (Meat Sundries)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 245, and shall come into force on the 12th day of June, 1944.
- 2. In this Order the term "meat" includes all goods of any of the kinds or descriptions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Application of this Order

3. This Order applies with respect to retail sales of meat of any of the kinds or descriptions specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MEAT TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any meat to which this order applies shall be the appropriate

rice fixed in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If in respect of any lot of meat to which this Order applies the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest upward half-pence.

(3) No additional charges shall be made by a retailer for wrapping any meat to which this Order applies, or for trimming or other incidental and customary services performed in relation to the retailing of any such meat.

5. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale any meat to which this Order applies shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to that meat as to be obviously in relation thereto a ticket, placard, or label showing in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound or per unit, as the case may be.
